Nature's Classroom: Hong Kong Pavetta has starry leaf surface





Hong Kong Pavetta (*Pavetta hongkongensis*) is a native of the territory. It was a new species in 1934, & therefore it is one of a plant name after HK. It's a shrub which grows to between 1 & 4 meters. The flowers are white, appearing between Mar & Aug. There are scattered nodules of bacterial colonies on the surface of the leaves which, are in fact formed by nitrogen fixation bacteria. When the sun shines through, they look like shining stars, so it is also known as "Starry Sky". The fruits are round & green, ripening between Jun & Dec. It has medicinal value; it can remove heat, detoxify, promote blood circulation, remove blood stasis, & help cure heat diseases, abdominal pain, injuries, fractures, bruises & strains. This is a protected species under Forestry Regulations Cap 96. So don't pick & keep it!
